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DIRECTOR'S NOTES:

I think just about every American has heard the term screwball, mostly we think of a crazy or eccentric person such as: "Sarah and Michelle are two screwballs!" However, there are other kinds of screwballs. A screwball in baseball is a pitch that is thrown to break in the opposite direction of a slider or curveball. It may also have a sinking action; it can break from left to right or away from the batter. If thrown correctly, the screwball breaks in the opposite direction of a curveball. It is also one of the most difficult pitches to master and is very rarely used.

But the kind of screwball we get to experience today is the screwball comedy. "Screwball comedy" is a subgenre of romantic comedy emphasizing a funny spoofing of love, while the more traditional romantic comedy ultimately accents love. Its characteristics are distinguished by a female character who dominates the relationships, men whose masculinity is challenged, romantic attachments between members of different societal classes, as well as a woman chasing a man who is oblivious or has no interest in her.

It's also one of my favorite styles of films and plays. I love snuggling in on a rainy Sunday afternoon watching movies like Some Like it Hot, Bringing Up Baby, You Can't Take it with You, It Happened One Night, and my personal favorite, Ball of Fire. As I dug into Four Weddings and an Elvis, I realized it too was a classic screwball comedy with a dominating female character (Sandy), challenges to masculinity (Vanessa and Bryce), romantic attachments between members of different societal classes (Fiona and Marvin), and a woman chasing a man who isn't interested (Bev and Stan). I hope you, too, will find the antics in this show as fun and funny as I do. Please sit back and have a good time and be thankful that you aren't part of a couple represented in this wacky comedy!
