WHO'S WHO IN THE COMPANY CONTINUED

MICHELLE SVENSON KINDY (Director) realizes loss and grief has little to do with math and yet finds herself constantly surrounded by numbers. There are FIVE stages of grief, "it comes in THREES", and "I only need to hold it together for TWO more hours" ...it can sometimes feel like a numbers game. She observes the true physical and emotional pain created by loss and grief, yet the journey of exploring this show along with her outstanding and thoughtful cast, presented those feelings from a multitude of perspectives. The one idea that struck her the most is the grief of when life doesn't turn out the way one plans. When a plan goes differently, but not exactly wrong, the disappointment or nagging feeling of what might have been can leave you struggling. When one finds oneself grieving the life expected, trying to understand this grief is much tougher to express and oftentimes even harder to recognize. The work on this show has Michelle truly rethinking the often-shared guidance from her Memere: "Be kind, you never know the battles someone else may be fighting. Kindness can transform someone's dark moment with light. You'll never know how much your caring in the moment matters". Michelle has been Theatre Jacksonville's General Manager since 2018 and has over 27 years of experience in the local, non-profit sector. Before joining the team, she served as the long-time CFO and Program Director at Jacksonville Community Council, Inc (JCCI) and as CreativeWorx Manager at WJCT, Jacksonville's NPR and PBS affiliate. She moved to Jacksonville from Canada in 1997.

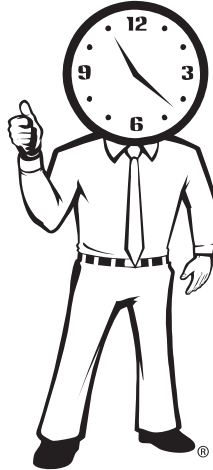

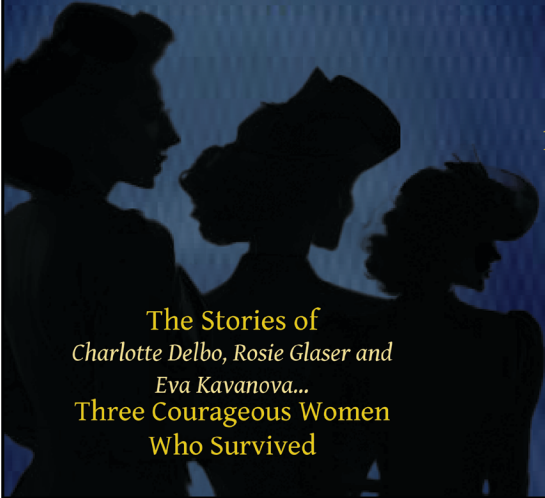
